



Assign Lines to Trunk Groups.

Page 2 Set the ARS Mode







Note: The Dial 9 is not examined by the ARS.

Note:

Your Local CO Lines must not allow 10 digit dialing.

Example: 212 555-1212

Long Distance CO Lines are in Trunk Group 1

When a user dials 9 and then the first number is a 1 (Long Distance), they will be sent out over a Long Distance Analog CO Line.

Local CO Lines are in Trunk Group 2

When a user dials 9 and then the first number is between 2 and 9 (Local Call), they will be sent out over the Local CO Lines.

Long Distance and Local Lines can be either regular Analog CO Lines or SIP Trunks.

If you press a button associated with a CO Line on a Panasonic multi-line telephone you do not need to dial 9.

Your call will be directed to the correct CO Line when you begin to dial.
